PE kit

NEW

It is essential that all children have PE kit at school **every day** including suitable footwear for outdoor lessons (**not shoes or boots**). When lessons take place outside a warm top and PE trousers/jogging bottoms are also required. Please remind your child that it is compulsory for them to change for PE lessons. If they don't have their kit they can not take part in the lesson and may face an additional consequence or sanction if this happens on repeated occasions.
